Social Capital

- Coined in the early 1900s by John Dewey. Pierre Bourdieu, James Coleman and others clarified and popularised the term in the 1970s...
- Robert Putnam/Bowling Alone & certain banking/government 'initiatives' brought it in to the public eye in the 1990s.

David Gauntlett writes of James Coleman's work in the late 1980s...

"He proposes a model in which social capital is one of the potential resources which an actor can use, alongside other resources such as their own skills and expertise (human capital), tools (physical capital), or money (economic capital).

Unusually, though, social capital is not necessarily 'owned' by the individual but instead arises as a resource that is available to them."

(Gauntlett, 2011)


I managed to side-step Bourdieu & and found other writers on Social Capital who were interested in areas more relevant to those I could identify with.

Niche things - less popular stuff that you can't find in town.


The 'tail' can generate as much 'capital' as the 'head'.
